### **Pakistan Ambassador to Discuss the Transition in Pakistan at UNF**

The World Affairs Council of Jacksonville and the University of North Florida have been informed that Ambassador Jeffrey Davidow, president of the Institute of the Americas and former U.S. Assistant Secretary of State, will be unable to visit Jacksonville on April 7. He has been asked by the White House to coordinate the Summit of the Americas in mid-April in Trinidad, which President Obama is attending. Ambassador Davidow hopes to be with us this fall.
